



LEBRATING 15 YEARS OF SAVING PRECIOUS ANIMALS!

Our organization began in 2007 because of a cat in Beverly named Millie, with a very sad story, that prompted Heidi Roberts (FOBA Founder and President) to act and to organize. Heidi and a small group of concerned citizens formed a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization called the Friends of Beverly Animals (officially incorporated in 2008). The mission of FOBA is to help animals in need and their people and to work toward the long-term goal of having a no-kill shelter in Beverly. Our dedicated volunteers have saved hundreds of animals' lives, placing homeless animals in loving "forever" homes.

This year FOBA has trapped, transported and loved a steady stream of fearful animals. We relish the pictures of seeing them settled into comfortable homes as they begin to relax and play.

FOBA is best known for rescuing felines, but we also assist in situations with Animal Control in Beverly and other animal organizations to relocate animals to good homes, assisting in any way we can. This year we assisted with a Russian turtle, husky and pug dogs, and guinea pigs.

Millie's story had a happy ending, and FOBA has had many successes. We have fundraisers to cover some of the expenses of caring for homeless animals to provide essential food, shelter and medical care. FOBA is an all-volunteer organization. We rely on your support to continue our work.

As we begin our 16th year of operation and approach the holiday season and the end of the year, we hope that you will find it in your heart to consider making a tax-deductible donation to the Friends of Beverly Animals so that we can continue rescuing these precious creatures.

Friends of Beverly Animals (FOBA) is an all-volunteer Section 501(c)(3) charitable organization dedicated to the care of homeless animals in and around Beverly, Massachusetts.



FOBA's mission is to better the lives of these animals through providing food, shelter and essential veterinary care; creating a network of foster and permanent homes; collaborating with other rescue organizations and shelters to help more animals in any way possible; and, ultimately, to establish a shelter in or near Beverly.

FOBA also works to raise community awareness of animals in need. We strive to reduce the frequency of pet abandonment and to prevent animal abuse.
